03 Days Workshop on Format Development for Pupil Teacher Handbook for Teaching Sanskrit at Secondary Level

From 26th to 28th August, 2019

The Teaching Learning Centre of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeetha, New Delhi organized 03 days workshop on Format Development for Pupil Teacher Handbook for teaching Sanskrit at Secondary Level from 26th to 28th August, 2019 with an intent to develop a suitable format for the above mentioned handbook in line with constructivist approach. The workshop was inaugurated by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of Vidyapeetha Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey followed by the welcome address and backdrop note about the workshop by Project Head, Prof. Amita Pandey Bhardwaj. The workshop was implemented through 12 sessions focussed on group discussions followed by presentations and their writing work. As per the nature of the workshop, 11 Participant as Resource Persons having the expertise in Sanskrit Pedagogy were invited from various schools and institutions but only 07 turned up and they worked under the supervision of four experts including the Project Head. The structural components and format for Pupil teacher handbook for teaching Sanskrit at Secondary level from classes 9th to 12th were discussed and it was decided that in addition to all the six lessons viz., Katha, Nibandh, Shlok, Geet, Manchniya and Samvadatmak natak in the handbook at Upper Primary Level, four more chapters pertaining to Shastriya Sanskrit Shikshan, Vyakaran Shikshan, Abhyas Pustika Prayog and Sanskrit Sahitya Parichaya should be incorporated in this handbook. Apart from the format development, the writing work of important points of the Ist and IXth chapters- Introduction & Vyakaran Shikshan respectively were carried out after thorough discussion. The feedback about the workshop was also taken on 10 points in three categories viz. Excellent, Good and Satisfactory. The average percentage on all 10 points in three categories was found to be 91.5% in Excellent, 7.1% Good and 1.4% Satisfactory. The programme ended with the vote of thanks by the Project Head and certificate distribution.
