

**Phase IV, Programme No. – 10**  
**05 Days Online National Workshop on**  
**ICT based Teaching and Assessment**

**From 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2021**

**Brief Report**

The Teaching Learning Centre (TLC) of Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri National Sanskrit University (Central University), New Delhi established under the scheme of Pandit Madan Mohan Malaviya National Mission on Teachers and Teaching, Ministry of Education, Govt. of India organized 05 Days Online National Workshop (10<sup>th</sup> programme of its IV<sup>th</sup> phase) on ICT based Teaching and Assessment from 18<sup>th</sup> to 22<sup>nd</sup> January, 2021. The objectives of this workshop were to familiarize the participants with various ICT tools & softwares, to provide insight & promote competencies for designing and developing ICT tools and to enhance skills and competencies for using & integrating ICT in teaching and assessment. The online workshop was conducted through **Google Meet platform**. The inaugural session commenced with the welcome speech and backdrop note by the **Project Head Prof. Amita Pandey Bhardwaj** followed by **Chief guest** address of **Sh. Atul Kothari** (*National Secretary, Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas, New Delhi*) and presidential address of hon'ble **Vice Chancellor of our University Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey** further it ended up with vote of thanks by **Prof. K. Bharathbooshan** (*Dean & Head, Faculty of Education*). The workshop was transacted through **30 distinctly designed sessions** comprising of Inaugural, Induction, 14 Technical, 05 Q&A sessions, 05 Self-practice, Online assessment, Feedback, Sharing of experiences and Valedictory sessions. The registration received till last date were 249 out of which 204 participants were given confirmation after screening. Although, 173 participants confirmed their participation but only 143 continued & 30 left due to their personal reasons. In **143 participants**, 130 were from **17 states** and 13 from **02 UTs**. The participants from 17 states include Andhra Pradesh (05), Bihar (07), Goa (02), Gujarat (02), Haryana (04), Jharkhand (01), Karnataka (02), Kerala (01), Maharashtra (22), Odisha (02), Punjab (09), Rajasthan (11), Tamil Nadu (07), Telangana (03), Uttar Pradesh (39), Uttarakhand (09) & West Bengal (04) while that of two UTs were Chandigarh (01) and Delhi (12). All the technical sessions were conducted under the able guidance of **eight Resource Persons** having expertise in the concerned area from various reputed institutions. The main themes covered in the workshop were – practical approaches on building technology enabled competencies for teaching & online collaborative work, effective searching techniques, ICT tools for interactive teaching, conducting online class by using different ICT tools, managing teaching & assessment through Google Classroom & Edmodo, simple ICT techniques, using Google Tools, 'Quizizz', 'C Map', 'Go Formative' and creating & using audio resources in teaching and assessment. The participants were assigned **10 assignments** on the basis of the themes taken up in the technical sessions. An **online assessment test was administered** where **43% of the participants scored above 60%**. In order to ensure the quality of the lectures delivered from the participant's point of view an **online feedback about the Resource Persons** was taken in 04 categories viz. **Outstanding, Very good, Good & Satisfactory** and the average found was **82%, 16%, 02% & 02%** in the respective categories. In addition to this, **online feedback about the workshop** was also taken on 10 points in five categories and the average percentage was found to be **80% in Excellent, 18% in Very good, 02% in Good** and **Nil in Satisfactory and Unsatisfactory categories**. In the valedictory session, the **Project Head** welcomed the guests and presented the workshop report followed by the **Special guest** address by **Prof. P.C. Joshi** (*Pro VC, University of Delhi, Delhi*), **Chief guest** address by **Dr. Pankaj Mittal** (*Secretary General, AIU, New Delhi*) and **presidential address** by our *hon'ble Vice Chancellor Prof. Ramesh Kumar Pandey*. The workshop ended with vote of thanks by Dean & Head, Faculty of Education and shanti paath. After the completion of the workshop, the e-certificates and e-photo album were mailed to the successful participants.
