The Institution consists of Shukla-yajurveda, Dharmashastra, Navya-Vyakarana, Pracheen Vyakarana, Paurohitya, Siddhant-Jyotish, Phalit-Jyotish, Vastu-Shastra, Navya-Nyaya, Pracheen-Nyaya, Sarvadarshan, Sankhya-Yoga, Advaita-Vedanta, Vishishtadvaita-Vedanta, Jain Darshan, Mimansa, Sahitya, Puranetihasa, Prakrit, Natya-Shastra Research and Publication which provide teaching and learning facilities to the students. Some of the Modern Subjects i.e. Hindi, English, Sociology, Environment Science and Political Science have also been incorporated in the undergraduate course. The students of UG and PG have also been provided knowledge of Computers and their operation. Apart from the above, the students enrolled in M.Phil and Ph.D. programme have been provided a 6 month course on Research methodology and manuscriptoloty etc.  The Department of Education, Faculty of Adhunik Gyan Vigyan is also an important unit of the Vidyapeetha. At present, this faculty consists of members from both traditional and modern teacherstraining areas of knowledge. This faculty conducts courses for higher studies i.e. Shiksha Shastri (B.Ed.), Shiksha Acharya (M.Ed.), Vishistacharya (M.Phil) and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D.). Students have been admitted in B.Ed., M.Ed. and Ph.D. courses based on All India Combined Entrance Test conducted by three language institutions including Shri Lal Bahadur Shastri Rashtriya Sanskirt Vidyapeetha, New Delhi. #### 4.2 Computerization of administration and library

#### Computerization of Administration:-

All the sections, department and faculties have been provided computer facilities with network & printers by the computer section of the Vidyapeetha. All the information (i.e. forms, bylaws, Course, Alumni etc.) related to Vidyapeetha is available on the website. Steps are being taken to implement the UMS software for computerization of all the department of the Vidyapeetha.

#### Computerization of Library:-

The Vidyapeetha Library names as MahaMahopadhyayaDr. Mandan Mishra Library (University Central Library) has been computerized. Propriety Library software has been installed in the Library and its various modules has been utilized. The library started e-service (Internet Facility) on 11<sup>th</sup> March, 2014 under which ten computers with internet connectivity have been installed to access UGC Infonet and other online resources to provide net surfing to the students. The library is also opened on every Saturday from 14<sup>th</sup> February, 2014. The environment of the campus is very conductive for the research. Orientation programmes are organized for new students. Close interaction with readers 'community is an integral programme of the Library.

4.5 Computer, Internet access, training to teachers and students and any other programme for technology up-gradation (Networking, e-Governance etc.)

All the Departments have been facilitated to access Internet services in the premises of the Vidyapeetha. All seminar rooms have been equipped with LCDs TV, Projector and Screen to facilitate the teachers, students and scholars especially for power presentation during the different National and University Level workshops and seminars. The expansion of computer lab has been done to facilitate the teachers, students and research scholars more effectively.

Vidyapeetha has established computer Centre to manage ICT. The Computer Centre monitors the information system & provides required information.

6.3 Quality improvement strategies adopted by the institution for each of the following:

#### 6.3.1 Curriculum Development

The mode of studies of different departments where convened to develop the curriculum in accordance with provision given under CBCS Guidelines issued UGC.

#### 6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

The vacant posts of Teachers were advertised after observing due process of selection. 15 teachers have appointed between July to October, 2016 in different discipline.

#### 6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Combined Entrance Test for admission B.ED, M.ED & Ph.D programmes were organized for admission in Shastri, Acharya, M.Phil programmes Entrance Test were organized at the Vidyapeetha after vide circulation of Admission notice in all over India.

After proper evaluation Admission were given as per the merit list of the candidates. So far as, semester exams were concerned, the Vidyapeetha has organized the examination as per the calendar approved by Academic Council & the process of centre evaluation was completed in time followed declaration of result.

#### 6.3.4 Research and Development

In the area of the research & development, apart from SRF, JRF research scholar, the faculty members are continuously working in area of their specialization.

The Vidyapeetha has established a central library wherein more than 89000 books, 200 journals and 4500 books in books bank. The library has already uploaded 250 Ph.D. on ShodhGanga. There is a publication unit in the vidyapeetha which publish the journal and Books of the Vidyapeetha. There are more than 50000 books available for sale in the publication unit.

The Vidyapeetha has established two computer lab for the student of Shastraic tradition and one computer lab for the student of B.Ed. and M. Ed. Apart from computerisation of all the sections, the Deans of the Faculties/HODs have also been provided computer with ICT facilities. Wi-Fi has also been provided in library, hostel, guest house and common rooms of the students. Swarna Jayanti Sadan, Brihaspati Bhawan, Saraswati Sadhna Sadan, Shaikshranic Sadan, Vishranti Nilayah and Boys Hostel have been providing basic infrastructure facilities for learning & teaching.

Availability of water and electricity are ensured by the Engineering Section of the Vidyapeetha with the help of 3 tube wells and 3 Diesel Generators sets. The 99.99% of the waste water is recycling and used for horticulture, greenery etc by the University.

Entire rain water of the Vidyapeetha complex is recharged into the Ground Water through 13 bores at five different locations in the campus. Rain water on roof top of all buildings of the Vidyapeetha is also conserved by roof top harvesting.

#### 6.3.6 Human Resource Management

The Vidyapeetha has been sectioned 120 teaching post and 125 non-teaching post. There are 5 faculties supported by Deans and 10 HODs to manage the affairs of the department. The administration of the Vidyapeetha is maintained by Registrar with the support of Deputy Registrar, Assistant Registrars and Section Officers in accordance with the provisions made in the MOA & Bye-Laws of the Vidyapeetha.

#### 6.3.7 Faculty and Staff recruitment

For the recruitment of faculty and staff the Vidyapeetha, recruitment-notices are released in leading newspapers, employment news and posted on the website. After proper screening of the applications received against the advertised posts selection is made observing due process of written test in the case of non-teaching employees followed by interview and the faculty member are recruited through interview based selection only.

#### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

As the Vidyapeetha has been established for the preservation and propagation of the shastraic tradition of teaching and learning, there is very limited scope for interaction with modern industries. However, the department of Vastu Shastra, Jyotish paurohitya etc. extend valuable suggestion to the industrialist as and when approached by them. So far as, collaboration with industries is concerned, there is very limited scope in the institution.

#### 6.3.9 Admission of Students

The Vidyapeetha carries out publicity for admission in various newspapers including employment news as well as through the website of the Vidyapeetha. For the admission in the courses of Shiksha Shastri, B.Ed, M.Ed Shikshacharya and PhD, combined entrance test is organized every year by three Sanskrit Universities on rotation basis.

As per the academic calendar placed on the website of the Vidyapeetha, students who are interested for admission in UG/PG courses are given adequate information about the dates, procedure of admission etc. Other details are provided in the entrance test form. Student's lists in accordance with their merit are placed on the website of the Vidyapeetha as per schedule. The eligible candidates are required to appear before the admission board of the department with their original documents in support of their candidature. After proper verification of the record, they are given opportunity to enrol as a regular student of the Vidyapeetha. Thus, the Vidyapeetha ensure due publicity and transparency in the admission process.

WHEREAS, in exercise of the powers conferred by Sub-section (2) of Section 32 of the National Council for Teacher Education Act, 1993 (73 of 1993) and in supersession of the National Council for Teacher Education (Recognition Norms and Procedure) Regulations, 2009, the National Council for Teacher Education has notified the Regulations, 2014 on 01.12.2014.

- AND WHEREAS, the institution Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi was recognized by NRC vide its Order No. NRC/NCTE/F-3/DL-65/1998/4311-13 dated 18.11.1998 for B.Ed. course for 180 seats.
- 3. AND WHEREAS, the institution Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi has by affidavit consented to come under New Regulations and sought for two basic units in B.Ed. which require additional facilities.
- AND WHEREAS, it has been decided to permit the institution to have two basic units of 50 students each subject to the institution fulfilling following conditions namely.
  - The institution shall create additional facilities that include (a) additional built-up-area, (b) additional (i) infrastructure, (c) additional funds, (d) adhere to staff norms as per Regulations, 2014 and inform Regional Committees with required documents by October 31, 2015.
  - (ii) The application-Institution for additional unit will be required to submit the required documents such as land documents, Encumbrance Certificate (EC), Land Use Certificate (LUC) and the Building Plan (BP) in the specified proforma available on the website to the Regional Committee in proof of having provided additional facilities before October 31, 2015. Building completion Certificate (BCC) may be given along with other documents if available, otherwise it can also be given to the Visiting Team at the time of inspection.
  - The Regional Committees shall arrange for verification of documents, inspection of these premises and (iii) check adherence to these condition by 20 February, 2016. If it is found by the Regional Committee that the institution fails to comply with these requirements, the institutions shall not be permitted to admit students for the academic year 2016-2017.
    - In case any existing institution's matter is sub-judice under court direction/SCN under section 17 of the NCTE Act/ Complaint etc., the institution shall be required to submit a copy of the Hon'ble Court order/reply to SCN/complaint/already submitted along with the documents, if any together the documents referred above. In case the institution's request for shifting of premises is pending, such institution shall be required to submit the requisite documents as per provisions of the NCTE Regulations, 2014 with a copy of the order/NOC of the affiliating body/State Govt, and such other documents as indicated in the revised format recognition order. The final decision shall be subject to the directions given by the Hon'ble Court in the Writ Petition/case decided by the Northern Regional Committee in respect of Section 17/complaint
- Now therefore, in the light of the above, the Northern Regional Committee, NCTE hereby issues the revised Recognition Order to Shri Lal Bahadur Shashrti Raashtriya Sanskrit Vidyapeeth, Katwaria Sarai, New Delhi for conducting B.Ed. programme of two years duration with an annual intake of 100 for two basic units of 50 students each from the academic session 2015-2016 subject to fulfillment of the conditions mentioned herein before 31.10.2015.

  - (d) Names of students admitted during the current session along with qualification, Percentage of marks in the qualifying examination and in the entrance test, if any, date of admission, etc.
  - (e) Fee charged from students.
  - (f) Available infrastructural facilities.
  - (g) Facilities added during the last quarter.
  - (h) Number of books in the library, journals subscribed to and additions, if any, in the last quarter.
  - (i) The affidavit with enclosure submitted along with application.
  - (j) The institution shall be free to post additional relevant information, if is so desires.
  - (k) Any false or incomplete information on website shall render the institution liable for withdrawal of recognition.
